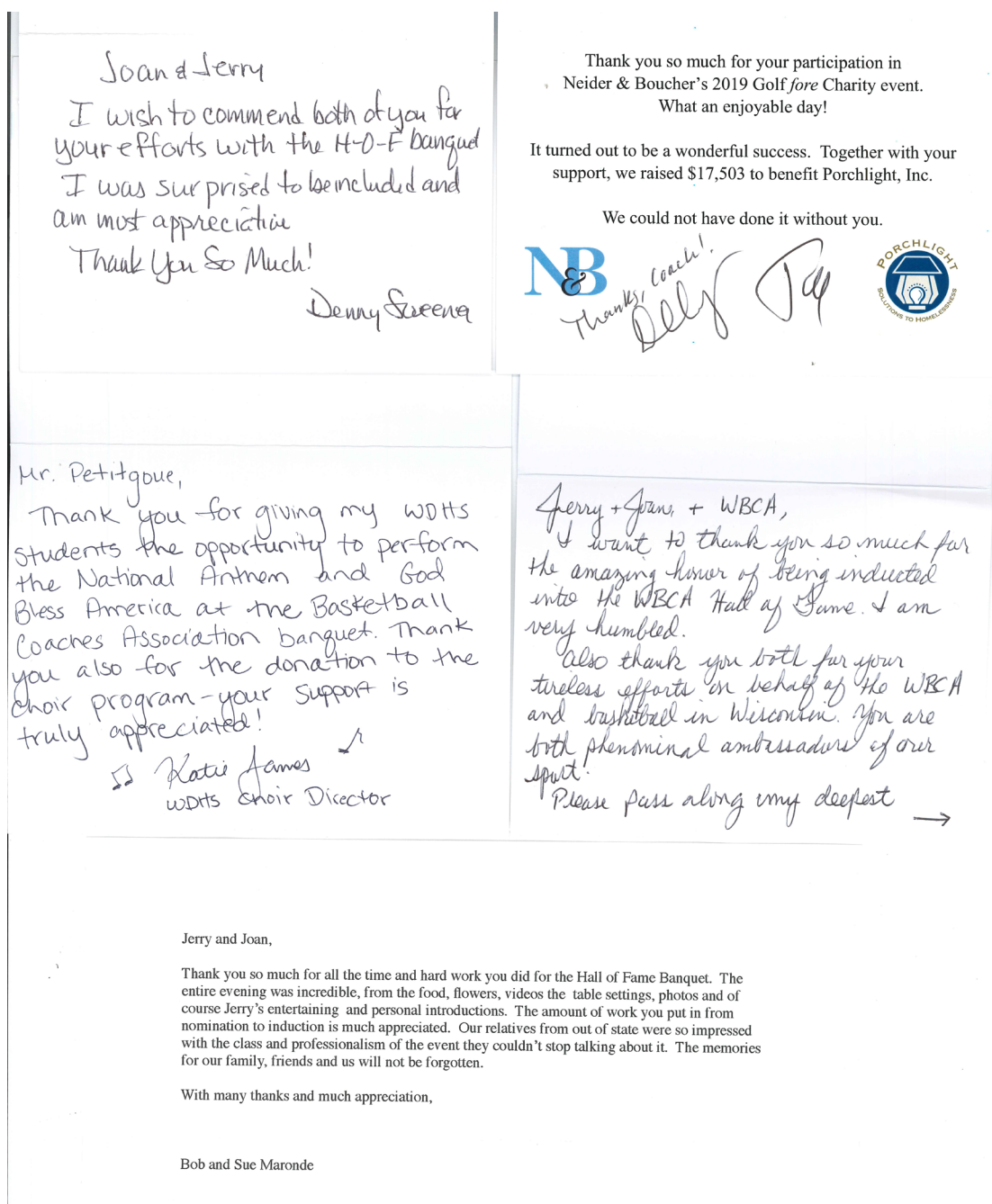

WBCA HALL OF FAME

The WBCA Hall of Fame was established in 1979 to recognize basketball coaches who have had great impact on basketball in the state of Wisconsin. A "Friends of Basketball" category was added in 1982 and in 2004 an "Officials" category was added. Finally, player categories were added beginning with the "Boy Players" in 2005 and then the "Girl Players" in 2010. In 1979 a charter class was inducted. The original Hall of Fame was located inside the University of Wisconsin Fieldhouse in Madison. In 2013 the Hall of Fame moved to its current location inside the JustAgame Fieldhouse in Wisconsin Dells. The JustAgame Fieldhouse is visited by over 200,000 people annually. A new Hall of Fame class is selected each year and an induction ceremony takes place each fall during the Hall of Fame Banquet at the Wilderness Resort in Wisconsin Dells. SEEDING UPDATE

After the last Coaches poll computerized seeding is becoming something a majority of the coaches in the state are in favor of. The first poll had 492 votes with 266 for computerized seeding and 226 for face to face seeding, which comes to 54% in favor. The second poll was 587 votes with 380 for computerized seeding and 207 for face to face, which comes to 64% in favor. The coaches I talked to voted no, mainly because they were unsure of the implementation. After speaking to them they seemed to be much more receptive. The way things look now we will seed just as we always have and then use the computerized models to compare data. We have a few people who will be giving us samples of what the computer will tell us. Then we will make some recommendations and see if we can move forward. As always, input is encouraged and welcomed.

A few questions that we will have:

- 1) Will we have an appeals process and what will that look like?
- 2) The cost and who will pay for it?
- 3) Year of implementation?

2019 WBCA SHOWCASE

The second annual WBCA Showcase Events were held on Saturday September 21st and Sunday September 22nd at JustAGame Fieldhouse in Wisconsin Dells. The boys event had 118 participants on 16 teams and the girls 54 players on 7 teams. 22 of the 23 teams were coached by current WIAA head basketball coaches from throughout the state of Wisconsin, with 3 other head coaches assisting with running the event. WBCA Hall of Fame coach Forrest Larson led a dynamic and high energy morning skill session on both days. Coach Larson was simply outstanding for both. His message to both the boys and girls was also on point.

All participants then took part in combine testing. Included were measuring wing span, standing reach, vertical jump, and standing broad jump. Those results were shared out on our website and with college coaches.

WBCA Hall of Fame Coach Jack Bennett, who was a head coach at Wisconsin High Schools and UW-Stevens Point for 33 years, led off the afternoon for the boys with an inspirational message for players, coaches, and parents in attendance. Coach Bennett led UW-Stevens Point to NCAA DIII National Championships in 2004 and 2005.

Girls participants were fortunate to hear from WBCA Hall of Fame player and former Miss Wisconsin Anna DeForge. Anna graduated from Niagara High School, played collegiately at Nebraska, was a 2x WNBA all-star, and is the state of Wisconsin's 3rd all-time leading girls scorer with 2,601 career points.

To finish the day on Saturday all 16 boys teams played 6 games. After 3 initial pool games teams were placed into platinum, gold, silver, and bronze divisions and played 3 more games with the team of Marcus Phillips, Bennett Fried, Trey Traeder, Zane Langreh, Brady Olson, Cole Deering, and JJ Paider finishing 6-0 on the day. That team was coached by 2019 Coach of the Year Jeff Boos of Sun Prairie. John Miron of Freedom coached his team to a 5-1 record on the day.

On Sunday during our girls event all 7 teams were able to compete against the other 6 teams. The team of Kennedy Sevals, Brianna Nelson, Camryn Nies, Mya Davidson, Layla Alt, Kloe Hillestad, and Alison Sprangers finished the day 6-0. They were coached by Appleton East Girls head coach Joe LaChapell. Mallory Liebl of Brookfield Central led her team to a 5-1 record on the day.

Five collegiate men's programs sent coaches to evaluate including the staff from UW-Stevens Point. Josh Hinz, the new head coach at Beloit College was also in attendance. Six women's college programs were represented on Sunday including Shirley Egner of UW-Stevens Point, Jeff Pustina of UW-Platteville, Gloria Bradley of Beloit College, Jeff Lorenz of Bryant and Stratton, Wayne Jentz of Dubuque, and Jackie Kriegel of Lakeland.

Next years event will be held in early September at JustAGame Fieldhouse. We look forward to working with more boys and girls from throughout Wisconsin. The level of coaching at our event, coupled with outstanding guest speakers, makes our event the best in the state of Wisconsin and we look forward to the continued support of our membership! Let's make this year memorable! The start of basketball season has, and always will, hold feelings of excitement and anticipation. The journey that you take each season, as a coach, is one that has a lasting impact for the individuals who are a part of your program. You are fortunate to be in a place where goals are achieved and dreams sometimes come true. It is both a blessing and a responsibility. I commend you for the investment that you have made to your community, your school, and most importantly to the kids.

I look forward to following the progress of our Wisconsin boys and girls basketball teams. Let me know if I can be of assistance to you in navigating through the NFHS and WIAA rules as you work to prepare your team to compete! Wishing each of you the very best for a memorable season!

Here are some important items to remember this season:

- **First Game** – November 19 (girls), November 26 (boys), after minimum of 7 different days of practice.
- **Game Limit** – 22 games. (Increasing to 24 in the 2020-21 season)
- **3-Point Challenge** – In order for your player to be considered “in the running” for the 3-Point Challenge at the State Tournament, you **MUST** enter their stats into WisSports on **EACH** of three dates. (December 20, January 20, February 24 [girls] or March 2 [boys]). I encourage you to set up reminders now for entering this data. If you have anyone who you think could have even a small chance of a stellar year from behind the arc, you must enter their stats. Previously, coaches could wait until the last week of the season to enter the information. For those people who want to follow along throughout the season and watch the 3-point race progress, this will give us a truer view of the competition. It is also more exciting for the players involved.
- **Ranking Officials** – Please do your part in ranking officials after each game. This is the tool that I use to choose the post-season officials. My choices are only as good as the rankings! You will help yourself by providing feedback after every game.
- **Rule Changes**
 - o By 2024-25 season all uniforms that have the number in the same color as the jersey must be phased out.
 - o Headbands (any item that goes around the whole head) can now be up to 3 inches wide. They must be unadorned and color restrictions **DO** apply)
 - o Hair Control Devices (any item that goes around the hair only) are not subject to color restrictions.

- o There are no restrictions on rolling shorts at the natural waistband seam, so long as they do not conflict with rule 3-4-5:
 - Multiple manufacturers logos are not visible
 - The drawstring does not present a safety hazard
 - The anatomy is sufficiently covered.
- o See the NFHS Rule Book for new specifications on mouthguards
- o Assistant Coaches are now allowed to enter the court in a situation where a fight may break out – or has broken out – to prevent the situation from escalating
 - Head Coach should have a plan of action – determining who remains in the bench area to control the bench players

- **Points of Emphasis**

- o Coaches have the responsibility of knowing the equipment rules and keeping the team in compliance.
- o Throw-in violations
- o Required pregame meeting between the officials and game administration.

- **Participation Numbers** – Don't lose sight of the opportunities that we wish to provide for kids. I am as competitive as you – and I also believe there is value in the experience for every kid on the team, in every role. Encourage and acknowledge every member of the team for their contributions to the program. Let's keep kids playing basketball!

- **Reminders**

- o All coaches are required to watch the Rules Video and take the Rules Exam.
- o All paid coaches are required to be certified in CPR and First Aid

THE VALUE OF POSTGAME FEEDBACK

It is common practice for officials to understand the importance of conducting a detailed pregame meeting, no matter how familiar officials are with each other. Successful officials are known for their attention to detail in pregame discussions and live by the credo, "The day begins the night before." These respected officials avoid on-court problems knowing that the game begins well before the tipoff.

But while the game may be finished when the final buzzer sounds, officials need to know that a postgame discussion is a valuable component in an attempt to take their game to the next level. These meetings are expected as you move into the College level of officiating. In my view, postgame meetings should occur at every level of officiating. Honest feedback will only serve to strengthen your game.

If boundary lines are not clearly drawn, postgame feedback can create a toxic environment. It should not be an opportunity of blow off steam or get something off of your chest. Dialogue needs to be delivered in a positive and respectful tone. The conversation needs to be framed around non-threatening questions. Here are some guidelines to follow.

1. Reflect on the entire game and quality of both calls and non calls.
2. Discuss any calls that were challenging or controversial. Remember that all calls need to be defensible on tape after the game.
3. Discuss what went well during the game emphasizing both double and cadence whistles.
4. Discuss ways to take the game to an even higher level for the next contest.
5. Discuss any rules or enforcements that may need clarity.

These questions will allow for a smooth transition into identifying any rulings or court coverage issues that may have sparked some controversy or confusion. It will also serve to strengthen rules knowledge and game mechanics for your next assignment.

Finally, it is important that you conclude a postgame meeting on a good note to ensure that you leave the locker room with positive feelings about the game. On the way home, I trust that you will spend a great deal of time reflecting, revisiting and re-evaluating your game. This will lead to having a "season of significance."
