BASKETBALL OBSERVATIONS

By Jack Bennett, Former Coach

Coaching has always had its challenges. It seems that parental expectation, the increasing role of AAU ball, community/fan pressure, time commitment during the season and especially the off-season, and the financial and time demands have contributed to high stress and the frequency of coaching burn out.

These observations are a product of three decades plus in coaching, observing family members in this profession, and the love and respect I have for the great game of basketball. Agree or disagree with the following, but at least seriously consider.

1: TOO MANY EXAMPLES OF "BETTING ON THE WRONG HORSE." Evaluating talent and getting players to accept and be grateful for their role on a team is underappreciated. Physical skill and talent is important, but mental toughness, attitude, moxie and unselfishness are equally important. We sometimes magnify the "neck-down" attributes and minimize the "neck-up" traits that create excellent team chemistry. Basketball is one of the greatest TEAM SPORTS ever invented. "The whole being greater than the sum of its parts" is not just a nice slogan. Coaches must make tough personnel decisions based on what's best for the TEAM.

2: TOO MANY COACHES FALL IN LOVE WITH the latest video, article/book, clinic topic or example of entertaining basketball at the expense of what they know and believe in. I believe you should be a student of the game while maintaining your program/team identity. Certainly talent and the nature of the game should play a part in "tweaking" your philosophy. Former UWEC football coach, Link Walker, said it best years ago when I asked him about his philosophy of coaching; "BE FIRM IN PRINCIPLE AND FLEXIBLE IN APPROACH."

3: THE IMPOSSIBILITY OF PLEASING EVERYONE. There's a paradox in coaching. Do you make tough decisions because it's expedient, easier and less controversial at the time? On the flip side, do you make decisions with what's best for the team at the basis of your thought process? I guarantee you will not make everyone happy, especially some parents and fans. Be fair, honest and kind during the process. In the end, are you making those difficult decisions because you believe in them and nurturing your personal peace of mind?

4: THE "MY WAY OR THE HIGHWAY" MENTALITY. This is not a contradiction of number two. There are instances when solid advice from assistant coaches, players and trusted professionals can be valuable. The inability to listen to sound

recommendations is normally a sign of insecurity. John Wooden simply stated: "It's not who's right but what's right."

5: KNOW YOUR BOSS AND YOUR SUPERIORS. Do you work for and with "stand-up" people who have your back? Do the people in authority defuse situations or simply throw gasoline on a fire? When you work WITH people and not just FOR them, you gain confidence as a result of trust. They allow you to stay standing through the storms.

6: GET OFF THE SOCIAL NETWORK. [Didn't think this would be a concern 20 years ago.] Technological advances are terrific when utilized properly. There are times when anonymous communication can be cruel, damaging and border on bullying. Relating to a team/program I believe in a simple litmus test. Does the communication UNITE or DIVIDE our house/team? Are parents, players and fans helping or hurting your efforts. I'm not sure what the solution is, but I strongly believe this topic must be covered during the early season meeting with the athlete and their family.

7: FIGHT THE URGE TO MAKE WINNING YOUR IDOL. Easier said than done. There is no need to apologize for being competitive. Winning and losing is important in our business. SO IS PERSPECTIVE. Faith, family,

hobbies and other interests can help keep things stabilized. John Wooden's Pyramid of Success was so insightful on many fronts. His key message was BALANCE. Balance on the court, with relationships and in life. If you are going to last you need to know what is truly important.

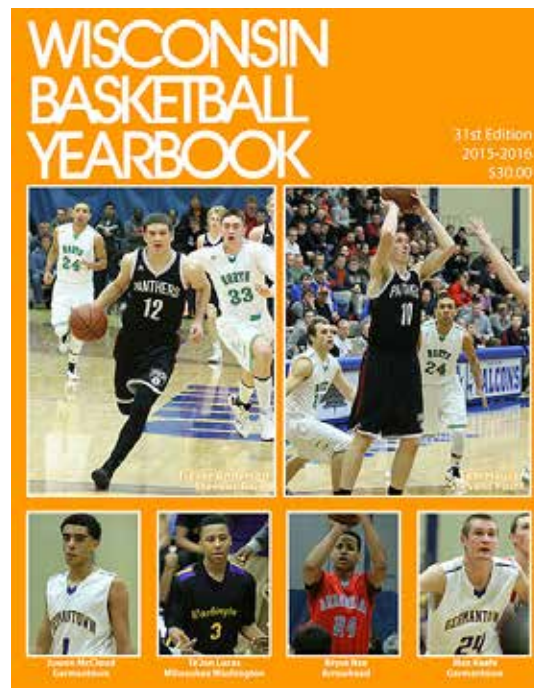

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO BASKETBALL FOR 2015-2016

The brackets for this year's tournament series are set. There will be NO voting on bracket design this year as the recommendation from the Basketball Coaches Advisory Committee to seed the half brackets was approved by the WIAA Board of Control in June.

We have several additional changes for the coming year.

A. All varsity games will be played in two 18 minute halves. No additional time-outs are being added. Each player is allowed to play in 2 halves per night.

B. All subvarsity games will be played in two 16 minute halves. Some conferences have asked to modify the playing time to less than 16 minutes --- and that is ok to do. Just make sure your officials know.

C. Junior highs will continue to play in the quarter format --- no halves for 8th grade on down games.

D. All high school level games will be allowed to use the coaching box. Coaches are asked to make sure that the box is appropriately marked on the floor prior to the start of regular season games. Junior high

coaches will be required to remain seated on the bench.

E. All high school level games --- mercy rule applies. After 1/2 of the second half has been played, the mercy rule kicks in --- 40 point differential clock runs continuously with stoppage only for time-outs and end of game free throws.

F. A 3-half waiver will be available to schools with low roster numbers --- see page 4 of the WIAA Basketball Season Regulations for details. The form for the half waiver can be found at: http://www.wiaawi.org/Portals/0/PDF/Sports/Basketball_Boys/2015/3halfwaiver.pdf

G. The order of games at the State Tournaments (boys and girls) has changed --- Thursday afternoon --- Div 3; Thursday night --- Div 4; Friday morning --- Div 5; Friday afternoon --- Div 2; Friday night --- Div 1. Saturday - 5-4-3-2-1.

H. Once we start tournament play, the higher seed (home team) will wear white jerseys for all regional games. Once we move to sectionals and state, we will revert to the alpha determination for jersey colors.

I. The 3-Point Challenge will begin at 9:30

a.m. on Saturday at the State Tournament this year. Contestants in the 3-Point Contest will be based on statistical information entered into WisSports.net. Most of you are already familiar with how to do this, as stats entry on WSN is also required by the WBCA for All-State and All-Star Game nominations, is required by many conferences, and schools as well. If you have questions on how to enter stats on WisSports.net or need additional information on how to do so, please contact Wisconsin Sports Network at info@wssports.net. Please be sure to include your name, school, and the sport you coach.

J. You will be allowed a party of 22 for the tournament series this year --- but limited to 15 total players in uniforms --- 2 additional spots for managers, statisticians, etc.

The rules video and rules exam are available on the WIAA website for all coaches and officials to view/write prior to the start of the season.



OFFICIALS SPOTLIGHT

All across this Country, there is a growing concern about the ability to recruit, train and retain officials for all sports. In particular, Basketball seems to feel the strain to fill slots for all games played. High School Principals, Athletic Directors, Commissioners and Coaches are seeing a growing problem in not only securing officials for all levels of contests, but also a change in the quality of the game officiating.

Many feel the problem is that more games are being played not only by high schools, but also competing non-traditional leagues. Where once it was a rarity to have "in season" AAU-type teams, it is becoming common at various levels.

Others feel the issue is "Sportsmanship", or the lack of it. Coaches, players and fans all expect perfection from officials. Understandably, this philosophy is born in the land of televised sports as every night we tune into games that are officiated by the greatest arbiters in the world. Every call is replayed and the announcers point out the "error" of the calling official. Then, the fans watch these games and transfer the same observation to a local high school game. In addition to those problems, the real battle

continues in ensuring that all games are played on a level playing field. How do we do that?

Recruitment

The days of expecting new people to show up at Officials Association meetings have long passed. Recruiting, just like at the college athletic level, is a yearlong commitment. The best associations identify a recruitment committee that actively looks to bring young officials into the group. This can be done through local colleges and high schools. In addition, placing notices in game programs offering opportunities for interested officials can be an effective way to send a message. Or, asking the local newspaper to publish a story on a veteran referee with a request for new officials embedded in the article.

Training

The worst possible thing a local association can do is send an untrained or poorly trained official to any game. Any official that is sent to work that game will soon be an "ex-official. A well designed and complete training program should include rules and situational discussions, on court experiences as well as a mentor program. Assigning young officials to work with a seasoned veteran on lower level games can prove to

be highly beneficial.

Retention

All groups lose members under normal conditions. People move, change interests and lifestyles, or retire. But to ensure that others continue to have a burning desire to continue officiating, a few things are recommended. (1) Evaluate officials as improvement comes when you know what you did well and what it takes to move to a higher level. (2) Plan fun events to build camaraderie among members. Consider including a spouse or friend to a special event. (3) Give awards. Every successful group shares the common trait of rewarding officials for their work on and off the court.

Certainly, High School Administrators have many concerns. Funding, gender equity issues, and filling coaching vacancies are just a few of those concerns. But, without quality officials to work contests, the integrity of Interscholastic Athletics is compromised.
