Shot Clock

Shot clocks for high school games are used in 8 states: California, Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, Rhode Island, North Dakota, South Dakota and Washington. Iowa and Georgia have approved the shot clock for the 2022-2023 season. The National Federation in April gave states the option to adopt a 35-second shot clock starting in 2022-2023. No matter what your feelings are on the shot clock, it is my opinion that in the next five years the shot clock will be adopted by most states.

Many basketball fans walk through the WBCA Hall of Fame without even noticing what is on the walls at JustAgame Fieldhouse. A fan could literally spend hours and hours reading each story and not see it all. The Hall of Fame was first put up in 2012 with stories starting from the first season of 1916 to the present.

If you have any highlight videos to add, please send them to us.

- -----All teams that have won state championships are new and are on display as soon as you enter JustAgame.
- -----Jerseys from over 250 school have all been redone and mounted in the Main Hall. If your team is not on display, please send us your school jersey and we will get it up.
- -----Norbert Durst and Travis Wilson have done a great job writing new stories that have recently happened and updated some old stories. Norbert and Travis will have more in the future. If you have a story you feel is Hall of Fame worthy, please let us know.
- -----The Hall of Fame also honors our retired coachers and officials. Coaches, if you are retired with 300 or more wins, and if you are a retired official with 1,000 or more games officiated, please go to the WBCA website to get a form and send us your information. We need help to get you on the Hall of Fame display for "Coaches and Officials".
- -----The Hall of Fame has a very large display of players that have reached 1,000 points in career scoring. Over 2,000 players are displayed in what we call the "1,000 Point Lounge". If you or someone you know has reached 1,000 points, please go to the WBCA website to get a form to register.
- -----Another new addition coming to the mezzanine above our main court is "State Tournament Records". We hope to have this up in the next month to honor those that set records for all stats that are kept in the history of over 100 years of Wisconsin high school basketball: who has the most points, the highest scoring game, the lowest scoring game and more? Did you know that the lowest scoring game in state tournament history was 7 to 3 with Edgerton beating Galesville.
- -----If you are a coach, player or a fan of Wisconsin high school basketball, everyone can be represented in the Hall of Fame. If you would like to be a donor to the Hall of Fame Museum, please contact us. All donations of \$50 or more will get a plaque on the Donor Wall.
- -----There is a new award called the "Legacy Award" which is now in its second year and is awarded to an Executive Board member and also to one boy and one girl player who have shown qualities of character, courage and service. The winner of this honored award is on display in the main entrance of JustAgame Fieldhouse.

2021 Girls' All-Star Games Loren Homb

I want to thank everyone for their efforts in making the 2021 All-Star Games the very best in the 39 years of their existence. Over the years, I write this article about the scores of the girls' games. This year I want to talk more about the good that this year's players did for the recipients of our donations. They were: MACC Fund, Camp Wawbeek, Garding Against Cancer, Hometown Heroes and Ronald McDonald House. The players and coaches, both boys and girls, went out and raised almost \$400,000 for their causes. There are so many networks within cancer research organizations that help children everywhere. Money spent in Madison and Milwaukee is used to develop new medicine and treatment, which is used worldwide.

The players, coaches and their families heard from a 22-year old currently in her fight to beat cancer at the girls' banquet. Meghan Douglas (my niece, making it very personal for me) was a three-season athlete in high school who went on to play college basketball while a nursing student. Hearing from a peer was very meaningful and emotional for the players. They heard first-hand the struggles that take place during a courageous battle with this dreaded disease and some valuable life lessons. While the players have been honing their basketball skills, cancer patients have been fighting for their lives. We were very fortunate to have Meghan speak to our all-stars. She is here today because of the players in the past that went out to raise money for our cancer fighting causes in the past. The impact of this year's players will benefit cancer patients into the future.

In my 36 years of involvement with the All-Star games, I have really seen the focus of the games change. The players are all great athletes and, more importantly, great people. However, the real focus of the games is on the kids with cancer and kids who are developmentally disabled through no fault of their own. Many players came up to us after their games and wished they would have done more to help in the fundraising effort. We remind them that the fundraising does not stop with the end of the games. Players, please do not lose sight of the big picture. In 1976 the cure rate for childhood cancer was about 20% and currently we are up to almost an 80% cure rate. We have come a long way, but there is more to do in our efforts to get that cure rate to 100%.

Thank you from everyone at the WBCA for your efforts and continued support of this worthwhile cause.

- Level of assignments worked during the recent season

With summer basketball almost in our rear view mirror it is time to think about how you will spend the fall preparing for the 2021-2022 season. The WBCA Showcase events will be held the weekend of September 11th and 12th at Justagame Fieldhouse.

There will be two different boys events on Saturday September 11th.

The first is for High Caliber (Varsity and JV level) high school players looking to show their skills to college coaches from across the midwest. That event begins at 9am and finishes at 2:30pm. WIAA OFFICIALS Where do we go from here?

As we prepare for the 2021-22 girls and boys high school basketball seasons, we are confronted with a grim reality. There is a huge shortage of officials. For some, this may seem not to be a "Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association" issue. But perhaps after reading though the next few paragraphs you will find that it will impact each of us, the schools, the games, and most importantly, the kids.

In 2010 the WIAA's arsenal of officials was at a healthy number in nearly every sport. For basketball, there were nearly 5000 officials. The nation was made aware of a trend in declining officials in 2019-20. The WIAA was still at healthy numbers with 4730 registered basketball officials. Then COVID hit. Officials stepped away from the game in all sports, including basketball. They are not returning. Today, our registered number of basketball officials sits at 2896. That is a decline of 41%.



It has become an urgent matter to both recruit and retain officials. Without them, the game becomes chaos. Without new officials each year, our numbers continue to decline.

How can we help? Let's start by making the job more enjoyable. The majority of officials who have left the game have cited poor sportsmanship, and verbal confrontations as a primary reason. Coaches, players, and fans can all make a concerted effort to respond better to officials who are "on the job" at your games.

Next, let's talk to our graduating players about the potential of becoming an official, after they have finished their playing career. College kids are always looking for a way to make some money while in school. This is a way to stay connected to the sport they played, provide a much-needed service to high school athletics, and make some money along the way. Can we all make it our mission to bring someone to the table each year? If each high school coach recruited one former player every-other year...we would increase our licensed basketball officials by over 400 per year. It would take us FIVE YEARS to get our pool of officials back to a healthy number...and that's if we retain every-single-one we recruit.


Additionally, there are a handful of high schools that offer an Officiating course to their students. The WIAA, in conjunction with these high schools, can offer YOUR school a training curriculum which can be implemented in order to forward our mission to increase the number of officials in Wisconsin. High school students can be licensed at no charge, and can begin to learn the techniques of officiating. Another possibility. Another opportunity to make a difference.

Let's get this right this year. Treat officials with respect. Talk to your players about becoming an official. Consider adding officiating curriculum to your school. We need you to invest for the future of basketball in Wisconsin.

Iowa Associations Announce Adoption of Shot Clock in Basketball

The IHSAA and IGHSAU will use the NFHS allowance for state adoption to introduce a 35-second shot clock for varsity basketball, required of participating member schools starting in the 2022-23 season. Use of the shot clock in sub-varsity competition will be allowed but not required. With a date set for statewide implementation, experimental exceptions will not be granted during the 2021-22 regular season.

To encourage standardization among states, 35 seconds was the timing provided by NFHS approval. Further shot clock information and rule implementation will be provided by IHSAA and IGHSAU as it becomes available ahead of the 2022-23 season.
