Kinziger, Momcilovic share WBCA Mr. Basketball award

John Kinziger never thought he'd have the chance to share the most prestigious award given to a senior high school basketball player in Wisconsin with one of his best friends.

So when the De Pere dynamo and Illinois State recruit found out he and Pewaukee senior Milan Momcilovic were selected as co-Mr. Basketball recipients, Kinziger found himself a bit overjoyed.

"It is a great feeling to get this award," the 6-foot-0 Kinziger said. "I never really thought of Milan and myself sharing it. That makes it all the better. Milan and I are good friends. We text each other every day and are very close."

A panel of coaches and media members from the WIsconsin Basketball Coaches Association selected the two standout seniors for the award, which is sponsored by Just A Game Fieldhouse in Wisconsin Dells and will be presented Friday evening at the WIAA State Tournament at the Kohl Center in Madison.

Similar to Kinziger, Momcilovic was more than pleased to share the honor with his AAU teammate from the Phenom University program.

"Sharing it with someone? I wasn't sure that could happen," said Momcilovic, who is headed to Iowa State on a basketball scholarship. "When I found out it was John, I thought was just great. He's my guy. We shared the same hotel room every time we went on the road in AAU. We ended up doing it together. I love that is was with Johnny."

Playing the point-guard position for the top-ranked WIAA Division 1 team in Wisconsin, Kinziger is having a banner season, leading De Pere to a 28-0 record heading into the state-tournament semifinals. The multi-skilled and always active Kinziger is averaging 18.8 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 5.6 apg and 2.1 spg. He has scored more than 2,000 career points and is a four-time first-team all-league selection in the Fox River Classic Conference.

"So far, the season has gone very well and earning Mr. Basketball just kind of tops it off," Kinziger said. "This award is means a lot to me, but the bigger issue right now is playing two more games and helping De Pere get two more wins to capture at state championship."

Momcilovic's shooting range compliments his ability to score around the basket and makes Pewaukee one of the best teams in Wisconsin. He has made 53-of-138 tries from deep for 38 percent while also averaging 22.9 ppg and shooting 88 percent from the line and 58 percent from the field. Momcilovic is a four-year high school player is nearing 2,000 career points and 200 made three-point baskets.

"I am grateful and honored to receive the award," Momcilovic said. "This is a blessing to my entire family. You have to grind all the time to become a good player, and it has paid off for me. You have to go in every day to your workouts with the mindset of trying to be the best you can be."

Arnold named Ms. Basketball

Germantown's Kamorea "KK" Arnold has been named the 2023 Ms. Basketball award-winner by the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA), sponsored by JustAgame Fieldhouse in Wisconsin Dells.

Arnold is an athletic point guard who can score at all three levels. She is a quick and explosive playmaker who excels off the dribble and is a nightmare for opponents in transition. KK has great court vision and is an outstanding passer, allowing her to pick defenses apart.

Arnold averaged 23.3 points, 7.7 rebounds, 7.7 assists, and 3.3 steals per game with 57 three-pointers made for coach Matt Stuve and the 23-6 Warhawks.

The 5-foot-10 point guard compiled 2,458 points, 765 rebounds, 695 assists, and 415 steals in her career, leading the Warhawks to a 97-15 and the 2021 state championship, the first title in program history.

Arnold is the first player in state history to commit to UConn. She is one of the top seniors in the nation, compiling over 30 Division I offers.

Coach Matt Stuve said there aren't enough superlatives to describe KK's play over the past four years.

Coach Stuve said she's been the consummate teammate, which says a lot for someone who has received the accolades that she has.

"KK remains a humble, driven, and hard-working person through it all. She treats everybody on the team with the same respect, whether it's the next best player or kid 16 on the end of the bench."

Coach Stuve added that as much as he'll remember her unbelievable play on the court, he'll look back more fondly on the way her smile lit up the gym and what an amazing young lady she was.

Coaches Advisory Committee April 5, 2022 MINUTES

This summary represents the recommendations of this Committee and is not to be construed as a change or revision of existing rules or regulations. Final action on all items will be taken by the Board of Control at their June meeting.

I. 2022 MEETING MINUTES

A. Motion by Adam Jacobson, seconded by James Wright to approve the minutes of the 2022 meeting.

II. SEASON REGULATIONS

- A. Review of 2021 Season Regulations
 - 1. Review of Changes for 2021
 - a. Last Year's proposals
 - i. Increasing the 8-team limit for Tournaments to 16 teams. failed
 - ii. Defining a tournament passed
 - iii. Official's pregame procedure failed (Take to Official's Advisory)
 - iv. Shot clock for non-conference games failed
 - v. Eliminate appeal for 3-Point Challenge amended one deadline, no appeals
 - vi. Release of Electronic Seeds two times during the season. failed
 - vii. Electronic seeding of full or half sectional, to be voted on by AD's annually failed
 - viii. Seeding the top 16 teams in each Division and distributing them equally into Sectionals. failed
 - ix. Redivisioning failed

Committee read through the GRID Rationale (Enclosure 1) to discuss why each proposal passed or failed. Entire group felt that the GRID Rationale is very helpful in helping them, and their fellow coaches, understand the discussion surrounding the proposals as they made their way through the committee process.

Rationale for why the Officials' pregame procedure had failed was because it had not been vetted by the Officials' Advisory Committee). Officials' Advisory discussed it in their Fall meeting and are in favor of it. Coaches Advisory decided to propose it again.

- 1.8 Officials' Pregame Protocol (NFHS Basketball Officials Manual, pg. 18)
 - 1. 15:00 Officials enter court and go directly to positions.
 - 2. 12:00 Referee goes to the table and checks scorebook(s), briefs scorer and timer, checks game hall
 - 3. 10:00 Remaining official(s) go across the floor to join referee, greet the visiting coach, then greet the home head coach.
 - a. Referee goes to area in front of scorer's table.
 - b. U1 and U2 will get respective head coaches and captains from teams.

- c. Referee does introductions of officials, coaches, and captain(s).
- d. Referee conducts pregame briefing to include discussing legal equipment and good sporting behavior with head coaches and captain(s).
 Also discuss team color, proper basket, other appropriate items, and answer any questions.
- e. Return to original positions.

Discussion: Wisconsin Adaptations have the Meeting with captains only, at the 12:00 mark, followed by the scorebook check at the 10:00 mark. New proposal would switch the order and include head coaches in the pre-game meeting. It also eliminates the meeting with coaches at the 1:30 mark.

Rationale:

- Checking the official score book at 12:00 minutes allows the referee to notify the head coach of any discrepancies before the 10:00 min mark, thus any changes can be made without penalty.
- Meeting with the head coaches and captains allows the officials to emphasize sportsmanship to coaches and players review any potential uniform or apparel violations, and emphasize any other game procedures.
- By eliminating the meetings with coaches at the 2:00 mark, this allows the coaches to meet with their teams without being disturbed prior to tip-off.

Motion by Steve Hicklin, second by Todd Hanson (6-0): Officials will follow the basketball pregame procedure as printed in the NFHS Basketball Officials Manual (1.8 OFFICIALS PREGAME PROTOCOL). (Removing the State Association Regulations for Pregame warm-up and Player Introductions, pg. 4).

2. Items from Committee

- a. Additional Timeouts
 - i. Discussion. Todd Hansen said that all coaches want more timeouts. Dan Witter believes this request comes from the pandemic when the COVID accommodations added an additional timeout each half, due to the players wearing masks while playing. Coaches liked the extra timeout. Adam suggested "why not?". Kate said that adding an additional timeout would be a change to the NFHS Rules which provides specific information on how many timeouts are provided for each team, in each game/half. Not action taken.
- b. Shot Clock
 - i. Discussion about the Shot Clock proposal from last year, why it failed.
 - ii. Committee discussed how many states are now using the shot clock. Kate stated that prior to the NFHS allowing the use of the shot clock, there were 8 states. (California, Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, North Dakota, Rhode Island, South Dakota and Washington). Since the NFHS passed the rule allowing for each state to decide if they want to use the shot clock (May of 2021), the number has grown to 20 (See chart). By 2025, the trend is showing that a majority of states will have the shot clock.

- iii. Committee discussed the WBCA Survey that was completed in December 2022, requesting all schools, participating in basketball to cast one vote for or against the shot clock. (A previous survey in 2020-21, of coaches only, returned 60% of coaches in favor of the shot clock) The numbers were strong in Divisions 1 and 2, but not for Divisions 3, 4, and 5.
 - a. 339 schools responded
 - b. 45.7% supported the implementation of a shot clock
 - c. 54.3% do not support the use of a shot clock

Rationale for motion:

- Implementation of the shot clock in high schools around the nation is growing quickly, and is likely to include a majority of states in the next year.
- i. With the shot clock likely to be implemented in Wisconsin in the future, a proposal which provides more than one year to prepare would be helpful to member schools.

Motion by Todd Hansen, second by Adam Jacobson to Implement the shot clock in the 2025-26 season, utilizing NFHS shot clock regulations. (6-0)

- c. Restricted Arc
 - i. Discussion about how the Restricted Arc would change the game. Committee agrees that a block/charge is the most difficult call in basketball. How does the arc make the calls better? Discussion on the rules related to the Restricted Arc and how officials would learn how to make the calls. Kate added that the coaches would need to learn how the arc works, as well, or could become frustrated with calls where they see feet in/on the arc and assume it must be a block. Steve asked about the additional cost for schools to put the arc on their court. Mark said that schools could put in the arc without refinishing their entire floor but just a portion of the lane. Kate added that a Lower Defensive Box would also need to be added at both ends of the court. After discussing, the feeling was that since the committee has put the shot clock proposal on the table, it would not be the time to also propose the Restricted Arc.

III. TOURNAMENT PROCEDURES

- A. Review of 2022 Tournament Procedures
 - 1. Review of Changes for 2022
 - 2. Editorial change pg. 9 [5d(4)(d)]
 - a. Ticket Allocations
 - i. "If a host school is not playing, it may retain only 50 tickets."

Host schools would never be playing in a Sectional game. Tournament Procedures call for neutral site. Should read "Host school may retain a maximum of 50 tickets." Additionally, the change should be made to (5)(d). "The same allotment may be applied to host schools."

- B. Items from Committee
 - 1. Tournament Expansion
 - a. WBCA Proposal
 - Discussion about the best model regarding the number of teams in each Division. Looking at last year's proposal, the increase in Division 1 teams was not great enough in the proposal, in order to expand to 6 Division 1 teams at State. Kate shared that the Board of Control was not opposed to the addition of two teams on Thursday morning, but the increase in Division 1 teams was not significant in last year's proposal, and there was no specific plan. Kate talked about how the cutoffs for Division 1 and 2 in Basketball are different from all other sports. Basketball uses enrollment numbers for Division 1 and 2 – but number of teams in Divisions 3, 4, and 5. Other sports only use number of teams to determine cutoffs. Conversation about how challenging this may become if the Competitive Balance Proposal passes. As all committee members reviewed the proposal from Terry Slack, Todd suggested that the number of teams in Division 1 would be best at 96 so that we can have 6 Sectionals of 16 teams. This was agreed upon by all. Next, the committee looked at Division 5. Currently at 128 schools, the committee talked about evening out the divisions by pulling some of the Division 5 schools up to Division 4. Michelle suggested that Division 5 should remain at 128. This left the committee with Divisions 2, 3, and 4. It was determined that these the remaining schools should be equally divided between these three divisions. Further discussion on the State Tournament Schedule. Adding a session in the morning

on Thursday – who would play in this session? Does the Division 1 Quarterfinals play in the 9:05am slot? The committee thought this would get fans to come to State at the

start of the Tournament. However, the feeling was that the attendance for the Division 1 games would be better if the game was held in the last session on Thursday instead of the first. The order of championship Saturday should remain the same.

Proposal:

Motion by Steve Hicklin, second by James Wright to expand the State Basketball Tournament to include 6 Division 1 teams. Divisional breakdown will be: Division 1, largest 96 teams/Division 5, smallest 128 teams/Division 2, 3, and 4, split equally. Note: If there are an uneven number of schools for Divisions 2, 3, and 4, Division 4 and Division 3, respectively, will include one more school. State Tournament Schedule as follows: (6-0)

ii. Thursday

9:05 Division 4 Semifinals 1:35 Division 3 Semifinals 6:35 Division 1 Quarterfinals (3 vs. 6 / 4 vs. 5)

Friday

9:05 Division 5 Semifinals 1:35 Division 2 Semifinals 6:35 Division 1 Semifinals (1 vs. 3/6 - 2 vs. 4/5)

Saturday

11:05 Division 5 Finals 12:45* Division 4 Finals 2:30* Division 3 Finals 6:35 Division 2 Finals 8:15 Division 1 Finals

2. Sectional Placements

a. Discussion. WBCA Survey results from 202-21 showed that 76.74% of boys/girls basketball coaches (546 votes) were in favor of changing the sectional lines on a more frequent basis. It was passed and implemented, starting in the 21-22 season. Steve Collins wrote to the WBCA to express that this was not happening throughout the state and that it has been years since things were "switched up".

Kate brought Sectional maps into the meeting for review. Discussion by committee on how the Sectionals are drawn, and how the Northwest section of the state, and similarly the Southwest area are not able to be changed much at the Division 1 level. Coaches will likely only see a change on the Eastern side of the state in regards to how the circle are drawn. Kate shared that the plan, discussed by the 2020-21 was that a change would occur every 2-3 years. The plan has only been in place for two years (21-22 and 22-23). The Sectional groupings in some areas of the state and in some divisions will change for next year.

3. Electronic Seeding

a. Discussion

Steve stated that the vast majority of coaches feel that electronic seeding is better than face-to-face. The belief is that the formula will continue to improve and that this is better in the big picture. Todd said the biggest issues he hears is with head to head and with sharing the formula. Conversation about Steve Collins e-mail. Requesting that the Electronic Seeding Committee look at the following things:

- i. Head to Head considered if teams meet in the first round change to "both team's first game", to replace "first round games"
- ii. Out of State competitions
- iii. Historical data to be used (strength of conference)

- iv. Human Element
- v. Reveal the formula
- vi. Seed the top 12 teams.

Some coaches feel that not sharing the exact formula makes it too secretive. Kate asked what RPI's or formulas are currently shared? The formula is simply an avenue to provide the best possible matchups in each Regional/Sectional. The idea that coaches would try to orchestrate their seasons around the formula is not in the best interest of high school sports. Kate shared that the hope is that coaches are making scheduling decisions based on the best possible experience and preparation for their team and players. The formula doesn't help them do that. Also discussed was the Reveal Show. Coaches and teams love this. If the formula is available all year, the seeding show would be obsolete. Teams would already know the brackets and seeds.

It was mentioned that there are coaches on the Electronic Seeding committee who know the formula. The question was asked why they are allowed to know the formula, when others aren't.

The committee agreed that electronic seeding is widely accepted. Dan said he heard less complaints this year than last. Kate indicated that the information they have shared will be communicated to the Electronic Seeding Committee for their review.

4. Out of State Tournament Size

a. This concern was addressed last year at the Coaches Advisory. A definition of Tournament was proposed and passed last year, which states "A tournament is an event that is bracketed and plays to a winner." The limit of 8 teams at a tournament is still in place, however this rule now does not apply to tournaments, showcases, classics, etc. that do not play to a winner. For example, a member school can now participate in an event that has 32 teams – if their opponents are determined in advance, such as a classic. The committee believes this request has been addressed with last year's proposal.

5. Shoot around at State Tournament

a. The 2020-21 WBCA survey showed that nearly 94% of coaches were in favor of bringing back the shootaround at State. Other committee members remember that in 2010 there were photos taken (head shots) of the players that were shown on the video board for the introductions. This was a fun aspect of the tournament for the teams. Dan stated that this is a facility issue and not possible, from what he understands. Kate confirmed that the Kohl Center would not be available. No further discussion.

6. Competitive Balance


a. A review of the Competitive Balance proposal. Are coaches informed. Kate shared that there were a few coaches who asked about the proposal at the State Tournament, and seemed significantly un- or mis-informed. The committee felt that coaches know about the proposal and what it entails. Mixed information on whether or not it is favored within the basketball community. Mostly conversation about how this will impact specific programs. The updated PowerPoint, explaining how the proposal is implemented was shared with the committee. No further discussion.
